On Thursday 8th Margaret Roper took part in the Catholic Schools Cross Country Tournament at John Fisher. We had fantastic effort from everyone and finished overall 2nd out of 12 schools. St James the Great were the winners. Aimee Healy won the Y5/6 girls' race with a really determined finish and all the children ran really well on a challenging course. Thanks for all the support we had from parents as well.

Remembrance

On Friday we held a moving ceremony of remembrance and an assembly at 11am, where we observed a 2 minute silence. Canon John joined us for this.

On Sunday, I was privileged to be able to accompany a group of twelve children from Years five and six on a visit to Cambridge. We were there as special guests of the chaplain on the Royal British Legion, whom we know through our Normandy school journey visits. We paraded with the armed forces and were inspected by the Lord Lieutenant; the Queen's representative. It was a very moving occasion on the exact 100th anniversary of the armistice and the children were

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outstanding, even though they had to parade for a long time, well over two hours! Miss Robertson then took the group on a tour of Cambridge, which was fascinating. Well done children; this was a rare opportunity and I'm so proud of you.
