

Definition: fronted adverbials are words or phrases at the beginning of a sentence, used to describe the action that follows. They add further information about the action in a sentence. Adverbials are used to explain **how (manner)**, **when (time)** or **where (place)** something happens. For example: She was waiting **by the bus stop**. The boy ran **as fast as he could**.
