WALT: To be able to use the words **first, then, now** to tell a Maths story.

Warm up: Watch or if you have the book at home read 'Mr Gumpy's Outing'

If you have a boat and 12 people/ animals (Mr Gumpy, 2 children, 1 rabbit, 1 cat, 1 dog, 1 pig, 1 sheep, 2 chickens, 1 calf and 1 goat) then you can use those to represent the characters from the story. If not, you can print out the stick puppets.

Today I would like you to tell a Maths story, based on 'Mr Gumpy's Outing', using the words **first, then, now**. For example:

**First** there was one person, Mr Gumpy, on the boat.

**Then** 2 children got on the boat.

**Now** there are 3 people on the boat.

Continue until you have included all of the animals in the story.

How many characters ended up on the boat?
