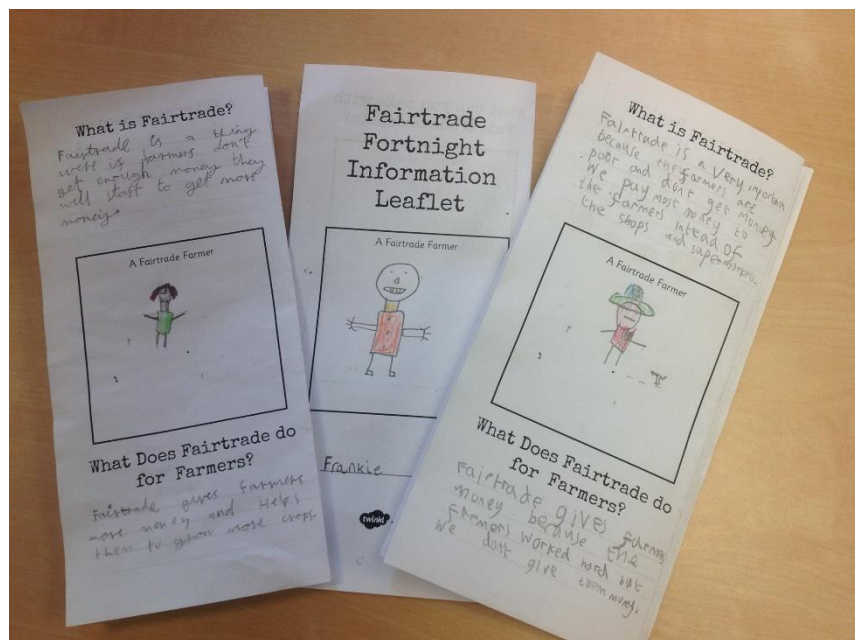
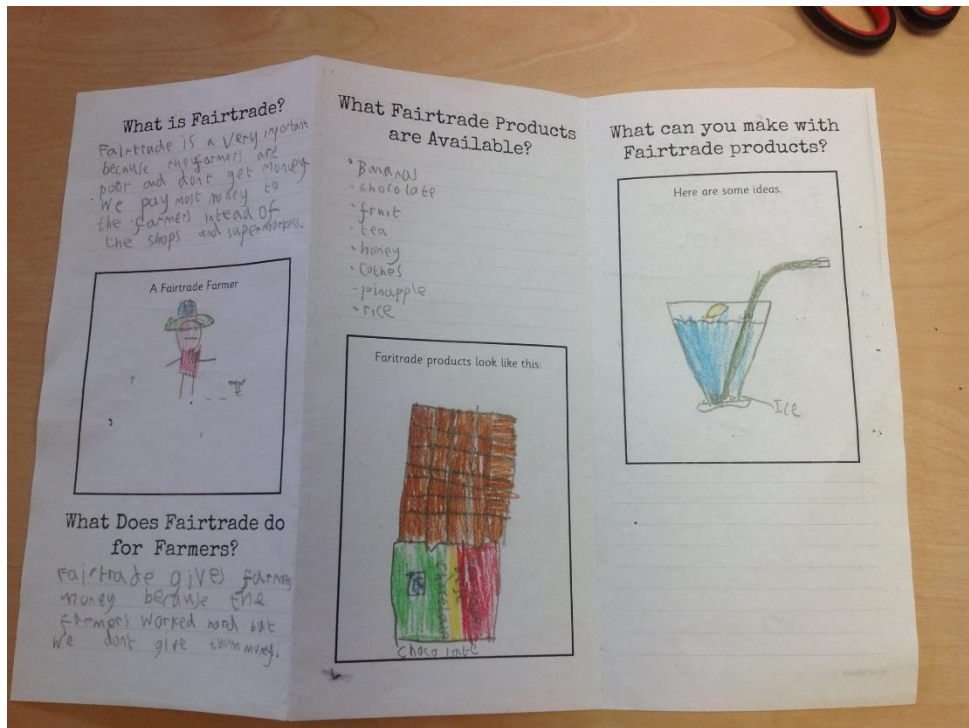

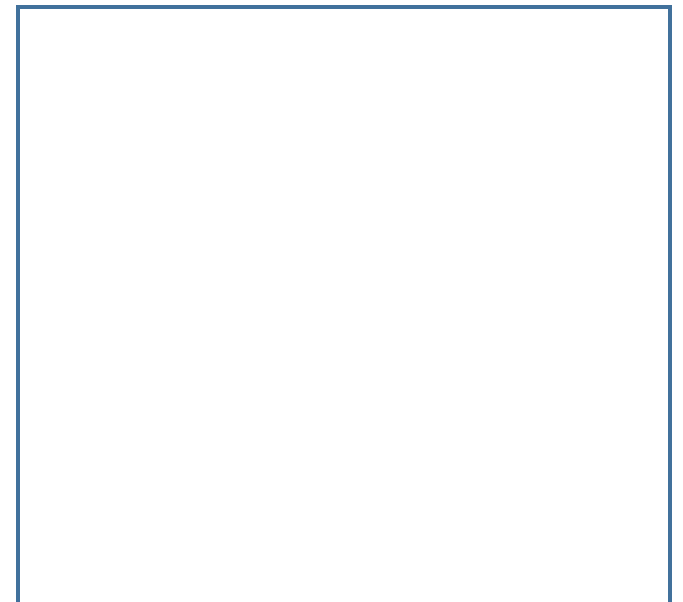
A leaflet also has lots of colourful pictures about the subject. I cannot wait to see all your lovely leaflets. I have given you a template on the next page if needed.
