
Children to first of all warm up their fingers either by:


- Disco dough gym play with playdough as you sing along to your favourite song.
- Lego.
- Cutting up paper to make into a picture later.
- Threading beads/ pasta etc onto string.
- Roll blu tak between their fingers and thumbs.
- Help to peg the washing on the line etc.

Once your hands are nice and warm let us practise sky writing (writing the letter in the air) by following the way 'i' is formed on the following clip:
