

WALT: To be able to identify odd and even numbers.

We are continuing to learn about odd and even numbers. If possible today try and go for a walk up your street and see if you can identify the door numbers. Write the numbers down on a piece of paper. Once you get home look at the last digit and see if you can work out whether it is an odd or even number. For example, if you spot 144, look at the number at the end, 4, then get yourself 4 objects. Remember, if you can share out the 4 objects equally between 2 then it is an even number. If there is an object left over, then it is an odd number. You could always use your tens frame from yesterday if you wanted (see below).





Finish by making your own model houses, using lego, junk modelling, playdough etc and then label each house with a door number. Last of all, line up one side with the even numbers and one side with the odd numbers.
