

We are continuing to learn about odd and even numbers.

Step 1: Print out the numicon pieces and cut each one out. Remember to have your thumb at the top of the scissors when cutting as "the thumb is the boss".

Step 2: Print out the posters. Next choose a numicon piece and decide if it is an odd or even number then put it on the right page accordingly. Remember our rule, if a piece does not have a friend then it is odd, if it does have a friend then it is even.

For example, 7 is odd as it does not have a partner at the top.



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10 is even as all the holes have a partner.
