Coronavirus – This is causing a good deal of uncertainty at present, in terms of what the government response might be as the virus spreads into the general population. We are receiving daily updates from the DfE and Public Health England. I know that there are many possible outcomes, including possible closure of schools, however we must continue to run our school as normal and respond to advice from Public Health England. Our school has not got any trips using public transport planned at present, however we may consider if these are sensible as time goes on. All school activities will continue unless we are advised to the contrary. If you are worried that a member of your family is suspected to have contracted the virus, please inform us and self-isolate and follow NHS advice.

We have been contingency planning for the possibility that school closure may be mandated and we propose to use online resources and direct learning through our website. I will, of course, keep you updated as regularly as necessary.

In school, we have focused on ensuring that we promote good hygiene with our children, teaching them how to hand wash properly, provided access to hand sanitisers (which doesn't replace but augment) hand

washing, and will continue to do so. All we can do is take sensible precautions and be hopeful that the impact of this outbreak is minimized.

Bookweek – We had bookweek this week and I must say that the ‘Potato Characters’ you all created with your children were just marvellous! We have a gallery in the link and in the Y2/3 corridor and I encourage you to have a look at parents’ evenings. Thank you so much for your support – I know the children enjoyed this very much. We had lots of other bookweek activities too – ask your child what they were up to.

Masses and Liturgies – Thank you to Blue Class, who led us in a lovely class assembly on The Eucharist this week. The children led our prayers and singing very well indeed.
