# PTA news

Mrs. Bond has organized for us a fabric recycle station, which is located in the school car park. If you have any items which can be recycled, please put them in and when it is full the company will empty it and pay our PTS a commission. Mrs. Bond writes:

'All Items are hand sorted and A class textiles and anything brand new is given to relevant charities they work with such as 'Hands on London', for example who they provide good quality blankets/sleeping bags/clothing to. B class textiles such as logo tops, washed out or misshapen items are sent to their contacts that send on to Asia/Africa. Any logo items such as sports kit, school uniform, is sent to a contact that sends uniforms out to disadvantaged schools and sports groups in Africa.

The aim is to keep as much out of landfill as possible and reuse as much as possible. So, although we hope to make money from it as a PTA even the stuff we don't get paid for will still go on to get re-used too'.

So, look out all items that you might recycle and drop them in the hopper. Many thanks
