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Parent Newsletter – Friday 27th November 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

We've had a lovely day today, videoing the Infant Nativity, although it has been very busy! Yellow, Red and Orange classes made us very proud and we are looking forward to seeing the finished video by the end of next week!

We are entering the last week of term and it has been a long and unusual term, so I think the children (and staff) are nearly ready for a break. Next week promises to be fun with a number of events to get us ready for the Christmas Season.

The children looked delightful in their Christmas Jumpers today, raising funds for Save the Children. They were so jolly. All pupils have an opportunity to wear their jumpers with any other clothes they choose next Wednesday, for Christmas dinner day.

Covid 19 - Updates

You may have seen the announcement from the DfE that schools have been given the option to close on Thursday 17th December, rather than Friday the 18th December. The rationale behind this is that schools will not have to run their track and trace for pupils and staff past the 23rd December. However, this offers little time for families to arrange childcare for the 18th December, so we are opting to stay in school until the 18th. School will close for the Christmas Holidays as outlined in our newsletter last week, with staggered finishes as outlined in last week's and this week's newsletter; either 1.15pm or 1.25 pm, depending on class.

In order to fulfil the schools' responsibilities regarding track and trace of positive cases during the Christmas Holiday the following arrangements are in place: (First two bullet points are text from the DfE).

- Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.
- For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.

It is important that, in the cases where a pupil or member of staff has developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school and then goes on to have a positive Covid test, school is informed. You should do this by emailing the head teacher head@margaretroper.croydon.sch.uk and copying in the school office

office@margaretroper.croydon.sch.uk. These email addresses will be monitored a number of times a day during the period 19th December to 24th December. We will then contact you to identify potential contacts and inform them to self-isolate for 14 days. It is very important that you do contact us, as we need to ensure that any contacts have been informed.

Of course, we all hope that there will be no positive cases identified in this period and the Christmas Holiday can remain unaffected.

I have been asked to share with you a letter from Rachel Flowers, Director of Public Health for Croydon. To go with the letter there is a flow chart which helps families to ensure they are following procedure for testing, isolating and track and trace correctly. Please read this information carefully.

We have been informed this evening that there has been an official announcement today re a change in self-isolation period. From Monday 14th December the isolation period for contacts will reduce from 14 to 10 days. The change to the isolation period for contacts will apply to all those who are currently self-isolating including those who commenced self-isolation before Monday. Self-isolation periods will begin on the day after exposure, a test or the start of symptoms.
