We began the spring term in a national lockdown. As you can see from the media, events are developing very rapidly and the government is responding to the significant increase in Covid-19 transmission with changes to life overall on a daily basis. We wish to thank you all for your patience, support and kindness. These are qualities that are shown time and time again in our community and demonstrate how special our Margaret Roper community is.

To our children who are learning from home, please remember to behave well for your parents and try your hardest with your learning. Your parents are having to juggle many different roles at home; be gentle with them and give them plenty of hugs. Embrace the opportunities of learning in other ways too - so many of you came back after the last lockdown having learned new skills or having tried new experiences, where possible do this again. We are so proud of you.

Our staff will be taking turns working face-to-face with the children of critical workers. They will also be setting work for remote learning. We are fortunate to have an amazing staff who are doing an exceptional job in difficult circumstances. Please bear with us and know we are trying our hardest to give all of our children the best education that we can offer in these difficult and trying circumstances. Parents of critical workers – it is so important for the safety of our staff and their families, and you and your families – that you only send your child into school if you have no other option. If you are working from home then the recommendation from government is that, wherever possible, your child/ren should be at home with you.

Miss Middleton is working remotely for much of the time; so the best way to get in contact with the office with a message is to email. Emails are continuously monitored and you should get a speedy response.

We want to evaluate how we are doing and how well we are meeting the needs of our children and families. To this end, we will be asking you this week to comment on how you are finding the distanced learning on offer and reviewing what we provide to tailor as well as we can. A short survey will be issued later in the week.
