## World Book Day – Thursday 4th March 2021

This year, the majority of children will be celebrating World Book Day remotely in lockdown, so we have adapted our plans and celebrations accordingly.

To get everyone inspired to read and write, we have arranged a virtual visit from the author Cliff McNish, who has written the international bestselling 'Doomspell' series, the warm-hearted dog story 'Going Home' and the fairy tale 'The Winter Wolf', amongst other titles.

The talks will be held at the start of our Book Week, on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> March, via Zoom, at the following times:

Reception, Yr 1 and Yr 2:	9.45am – 10.45am
Yr 3/4/5/6:	11.00am – 12.00pm

Your child's class teacher will advise you of the Zoom meeting details nearer the time, and will also confirm arrangements for each class if the author visit clashes with the regular class Zoom session.

We will also be holding a virtual version of our traditional Margaret Roper 'Literary Mastermind', pitting our Year 6 bookworms against Mr Mooney's challenging questions, which all are invited to attend. This will be held on the afternoon of Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March, via Zoom. Details of the Zoom meeting will be published in the school newsletter.

As we cannot physically all be together as a school community, we thought it would be nice to virtually share a book as a whole school, and celebrate our enjoyment of reading as a whole school community. The teachers have planned lots of fun activities for all classes throughout the week, based on the book 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner, which will be delivered through Google Classroom and the daily Zoom sessions in the usual way.

Last year, we loved seeing the wonderfully imaginative creations the children made for their World Book Day potatoes, and we are asking them to undertake the same again this year.

We recognise that home learning takes up lots of time and energy as it is, so creating a World Book Day potato is entirely optional. However, if your child would like to take part, the potatoes should be decorated as their favourite book character.
