Please read the letter from Archbishop John carefully. Also included is a smaller letter, which the Archbishop has asked if you could share with somebody you know who might not have returned to Mass as yet. If you can pass it on, then please do.

Last Sunday was Trinity Sunday, and in our assembly, we thought about the mystery of the Holy Spirit. This Thursday was the feast of Corpus Christi (Body of Christ) and this is celebrated on the Sunday 17th. So, it is a very appropriate time to consider how our faith is enriched and restored by receiving Christ in the Eucharist.

Sunday is also Father's Day and inspired by St Joseph, the foster-father to Jesus who shows us that there are many ways of being a father. Each of us has our own experience of what a father means to us; some may have happy thoughts and others may not. But whether we have happy thoughts or sad thoughts about fathers, the good news is that each of us has a loving Father in heaven!
